What You Need to Know About Your Medicaid Renewal

Looking for your Medicaid renewal information?

Log in to your account at HealthyRhode.Rl.gov. If you don't have an account, you can create one and sign up to get documents from us electronically.

Medicaid renewals are a way for the State to make sure everyone who's enrolled in Medicaid is still eligible. The State won't renew everyone at once. You'll get a notice in the mail sometime between now and April 2024 when it's your turn to renew.

If you have Medicaid, here's what you need to know about renewals:

You still have Medicaid while you wait for your renewal notice.

Once you've gotten your Medicaid renewal notice, please read it and provide any documents requested by the due date on your notice. As long as you submit any requested information by the due date, you're still covered while we determine if you're still eligible for Medicaid. If we don't ask for any documents or information, just check the information you see on your renewal notice. Let us know if there are any mistakes or changes that need to be made.

It's important to make sure your contact information is correct.

When we send your Medicaid renewal notice, you don't want to miss it! We will mail it to the address we have for you. Or, if you have chosen to have your notices delivered electronically, your Medicaid renewal notice will be in your account at HealthyRhode.Rl.gov.

You can check or update your contact information by visiting healthyrhode.ri.gov or by logging in to the HealthyRhode mobile app. Enter your username and password. Then:

- Click "My Profile." Then click "My Contact Information."
- Check your name, mailing address, phone number(s), and email address. Save any changes.
- If you want to, you can sign up for text messages about your coverage. Click "My Contact Information" and check "Sign Up for Text Messages."
